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#### 1. GOD

We believe that there is but one God, who through His infinite wisdom and almighty power, created heaven and earth (Exodus 20:2, 3; Isaiah 45:5, 6, 18.)

God is a spiritual being (John 224), eternal, without beginning and without end (Revelation 21.6), omnipresent (Psalm 139:1-12), dwelling in the heavens; He cannot be seen by man in his present, sinful state. (1 Timothy 6:16; Isaiah 59:2; John 1:18; Exodus 33:20.) Only through faith are we able to come to God. (Hebrews 11:6.)

### 2. JESUS CHRIST

We believe that Jesus Christ is the living Son of God and that He is one in nature with the Father. (Hebrews I:1-3, 5.) Through Him all things have since eternity been created, whether in heaven of the earth (Colossians 1:15-17) Christ alone, therefore, can be the Mediator between God and men. (1 Timothy 2:5.) In harmony with the testimony of the prophets, He was conceived by the Spirit of God through the virgin Mary and was born as man on this earth in Bethlehem. (Matthew 1:18-23.) Only through faith in His death and His freely offered grace may we be saved (Luke 1:77-79; Acts 4:12; John 3:14.15, Ephesians 2:3-6.)

## 3. THE HOLY SPIRIT

We believe that the Holy Spirit the representative of Christ on earth. (John 14:16.) Without Him it is simpossible to comprehend and live according to the will of God Also, it is not possible to rightly interpret the divine Word without the aldo, of the Holy Spirit (John 14:26; 1 Corinthians 2:11.) He is the power from the Father and the Son and also active through human beings. (2 Feter 121; 1 Peter 1:11).

The Holy Spirit is one with the Father and the Son and therefore believers are baptized not only in these names but also in the name of the Holy Spirit, after they have become acquainted with Him. (Matthew 28:19: 1 John 5:7; 2 Corinthians 18:14.)

# 4. THE HOLY SCRIPTURES

We believe that both the New and the Old Testament of the Holy Scriptures are the Word of God and as such reveal the will of God. (John 5:39.)

The Bible was written by the firshiration of the Holy Spirit. (2 Timothy 3:16; Romans 2:16; Revelation 1:2); and constitutes our guide and rule of life, in addition to containing all of God's plan of redemption; and no church tradition or catechism is needed (Isaian 34:16; Revelation 22:18, 19; John 5:39; 10:35, last part; Matthew 15:9; Preverbs 30:6:)

#### 5. THE LAW OF GOD

(The law of morals and manners of the ten commandments.)

We believe that Christ did not come to Improve in any way upon the law as written by God with His own linger on Mount Sinai (Matthew 5:17; Psalm 119:142), because the ten commandments" are perfect and it is impossible to improve them. (Psalm 19.8)

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# CONSTITUTION OF THE CHURCH.

A short exposition edited by the General Conference of the Seventh-Day Adventist "Reform Movement" during the session held in Europe, July 14-20th, 1925, and accepted in Australia, January, 19th 1940.

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### INTRODUCTION.

The Last Great Reformation of the everlasting Gospel has started in the countries where the Message of the Second Advent of Christ is preached, and the spreading of it is founded on—Rev. 14:6-12.

The prophesied apostasy among the Advent people compels us to publish the principles of the faith of the Third Angel's Message.

For distinction from the many different Adventists, we call ourselves—according to the Spirit of Prophecy—"Reform Movement." Therefore we are called the "Seventh-Day Adventist Reform Movement."

May all those who seek perfect satisfaction in Christ come to a knowledge of "THE LAW AND THE TEST! MONIES," and accept the counsel of Jesus in "the shaking"—lifting up the standard and preaching t in its fullness.

WITH PRAYER, we send out these instructive proof faith.

# THE PRINCIPLES OF FAITH OF THE CHURCH

#### 1. GOD.

We believe that there is only one God, Who created the Heaven and the Earth by His mighty power. (Ex. 20:2-3; Isaiah 45:5, 6, 18).

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#### 2. JESUS CHRIST.

We believe that Jesus Christ is the living Son of God and is one with the Father (Heb. 1:1-3, 5). By Him all things were created, both in heaven and on earth (Col. 1:15-17). Therefore only He can be the mediator between God and Man (1 Tim. 2:5).

He was born as a human being here on earth in Bethlehem from the Virgin Mary, in harmony with the testimony of the prophecy—through the Spirit of God (Matt. 1:18-23). Only through His death, according to the grace given us can we be saved (Luke 1:77-79, Acts 4:12, John 14:14).

#### 3. THE HOLY SPIRIT.

We believe that the Holy Spirit is Christ's representative on carth (John 14-16). Without the agency of the Spirit it is impossible to be acquainted with the will of God and to fulfill it. It is impossible to correctly interpret the inspired words of Scripture without the Holy Spirit (John 14:26, 1 Cor. 2-11). He has power from the Father and the Son to work through men (2 Pet. 1:21, 1 Pet. 1:11).

The Holy Spirit is one with the Father and the Son and when the believer is baptised he should be immersed in the name of the Holy Spirit, after he has become acquainted with Him (Matt: 28:19, 1 John • 5:7).

### 4. THE HOLY SCRIPTURES.

We believe that the Old Testament, together with the New Testament, constitutes the Holy Scriptures, the Word of God, which
